5 para 2 – life imprisonment guarantee	GUARANTEE
5 para 3 – return to serve guarantee	MANDATORY ground for nationals
	GUARANTEE for residents





Optional grounds (and guarantee) as mandatory

- Protect sovereignty (nationals, double criminality)
- Important principles/rules of public order (statute of limitation)
- Lengthy decisions / extensive use of 15 (2)
- Serious difficulties in execution and impact of mutual trust





An example: territorial jurisdiction (Art 4 para 7(i))

- No choice but to refuse!
- ■Interpertation of territorial jurisdiction geogr position
- Lenient sentencing regime: defence!
- Greek prosecution not as effective: e.g. human trafficking BE, Cyber crimes
- Attemps to 'save' cases: French case "Thieves in Law" Improving mutual recognition of European Arrest Warrant through Common Practical Guidelines, Lublin, 27-28 June 2022





Disciminatory position of nationals – Art 4 (6), 5 (3)

- Not aim at discrimination but protection of nationals
- Legislative intention not rehabilitation!
- Consent/triggering by individual is not required mandatory!
- Non-nationals extra burden: acquire declaration by Ministry until 2012 but still required sporadically
- Lenient sentencing regime, Art 4 (6) not recognised by other MS!
